The North Carolina Folk Festival Announces 3rd Year of the Not Your Average Folk Contest

Applications Open Today for North Carolina-Based Musicians

Greensboro, N.C., May 15, 2023 — The North Carolina Folk Festival announced the return of the *Not Your Average Folk Contest* today. This marks the 3rd year of the contest for North Carolina-based independent musicians to compete for a chance to perform at the festival in September. Applications open online today and will be accepted through June 12, 2023.

The <u>Not Your Average Folk Contest</u> is open to musicians who live in or are based in North Carolina and are not signed to a major record label. Applications are reviewed and scored by a panel of judges who select four finalists. The four finalists are promoted on the festival's website and social media platforms, and the public is invited to select the winners by casting votes online. Prizes will be awarded to the four finalists based on the outcome of the online popular vote. Prizes include:

(1st Place, most votes accumulated through online voting)

- 1x performance at the 2023 Season on Saturday on a main stage.
- 16 hours of studio recording time (studio A) with Black Rabbit Audio.
- 16 hours of video content during studio recording time.

Second Prize

- 1x performance at the 2023 Season on a secondary stage, the "VIP Lounge," or a comparable performance opportunity.
- 8 hours of studio recording time (studio B) with Black Rabbit Audio.

Third Prize

- 1x performance at the 2023 Season on a secondary stage, the "VIP Lounge," or a comparable performance opportunity.
- 8 hours of studio recording time (studio B) with <u>Black Rabbit Audio</u>.

In addition to performing on stage at the <u>NC Folk Fest</u>, past grand prize winners have been awarded a studio recording session from Greensboro's <u>Black Rabbit Audio</u>. This year, <u>Black Rabbit Audio</u> will increase their prize offering to include studio recording time for additional winners.

"Black Rabbit Audio is proud to sponsor the Not Your Average Folk Contest for the 3rd year," said Tom Troyer, owner and head engineer at Black Rabbit Audio. "Now we're going a few steps further by extending studio recording time to second and third place winners as well! We look forward to the best round of musicians and performers yet!"

Prior grand prize winners of the <u>Not Your Average Folk Contest</u> include <u>Lorena Guillén Tango Ensemble</u> of Greensboro (2021), and <u>Anna Vtipil</u> of Raleigh (2022). Each performed at the NC Folk Fest and have recorded projects with <u>Black Rabbit Audio</u>.

"When we launched the contest our goal was to shine a light on homegrown musical talent in North Carolina," said Amy Grossmann, President and CEO of the North Carolina Folk Festival. "After two successful years of welcoming our winners on stage at the festival, and through a deepening partnership with Black Rabbit Audio, we are thrilled to continue supporting and amplifying our state's talented musicians!"
